Class year	2Ls and 3Ls* (3L students must be able to demonstrate that they have satisfied all of their graduation requirements (other than the total credits needed) before going, or that they will be able to satisfy their remaining requirements in the second semester of their 3L year if they seek to go in the fall semester. 3Ls who choose the spring semester should be aware that their courses and exams will not end in time for them to receive their degrees at the May Notre Dame commencement. Although they can, at their own expense, return to participate in the Commencement ceremonies, they will not formally receive their degrees until August, which could prevent those students from sitting for bar exams in the summer.)					
Term	A single-semester exchange is preferred but in exceptional circumstances and for compelling reasons we can consider a student request to attend for an entire year.					
Grades and credit	Credits earned will transfer to Notre Dame and will count toward degree requirements, but any grades earned in these courses will not count in a student's overall GPA calculation at Notre Dame.					
Tuition	Participating students will continue to pay their regular tuition to Notre Dame; no tuition will be due to the exchange school.					
Scholarship and Financial Aid	The merit scholarship that was awarded to the student for their study at Notre Dame will also be available to them while abroad, but the available student loan amounts will be adjusted to account for travel expenses and cost of living differences.
