Before “The New Stock Market:” Reframing the History and Role of Regional Stock Exchanges

Regional stock exchanges once anchored American cities from Cincinnati and Detroit to St. Louis and Pittsburgh. Emerging in the late nineteenth century, they grew into dynamic institutions that at their peak handled up to fourteen percent of U.S. trading volume. Yet by the early 2000s, nearly all had disappeared, absorbed or eclipsed by national exchanges. Despite this dramatic trajectory, regional exchanges remain largely absent from scholarship and from the policy imagination. In this work-in-progress, I offer the first systematic comparative archival study of multiple regional exchanges, drawing on trading ledgers, governance files, membership records, and strategic correspondence from several regional stock exchanges. My analysis reveals how these institutions actually functioned and adapted as complements to, not competitors with, the New York Stock Exchange. While prior scholarship has gestured at this complementarity, my contribution provides the first unified, multi-exchange archival account that demonstrates complementarity as a consistent and evolving structural feature of U.S. securities markets. The history of regional exchanges underscores how subnational law once structured access to capital and provided communities with financial infrastructure—raising questions that resonate with contemporary literature on local autonomy and the costs of centralization. The answers to these questions are essential for building markets that are not only efficient, but democratic, inclusive and resilient.

Should We Revive Regional Securities Exchanges?

Considering the purported benefits of local exchanges to local companies (startups or otherwise), local economies, communities, and individual investors, some have expressed interest in reestablishing local stock exchanges. Proponents include community development advocates, academics, state government and even a commissioner at the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. However, to date there has been limited legal analysis of any proposal to reestablish local stock exchanges – despite concrete efforts underway to do so. For example, Lancaster, Pennsylvania attempted to establish its own local exchange to serve the investors and firms in its metropolitan area, and the Hawaii state legislature convened a working group to identify the issues relevant to establishing an exchange there. A revival of local exchanges could upend the current system of regulating the trading of securities in the United States and may represent yet another attempt by cities to regulate mobile capital. Informed by my exploration of the historical role of regional stock exchanges, in this work-in-progress I intend to analyze proposals to reestablish regional stock exchanges, and their impact on the current market structure and regulatory framework for trading securities in the United States. This project has implications for financial inclusion, for impact investors increasingly interested in portfolios with diversified local assets, and for access to capital by startups – especially those who have been shut out by the current system of capital formation.

Radical Rural Litigation (with Sarah Swan)

When large cities like New York City or Chicago sue third party wrongdoers like opioid manufacturers or firearm distributors, people pay attention. Meanwhile, largely underneath the radar, rural communities have been quietly engaged in both bringing forward innovative litigation, and in radically reimagining the legal landscape itself. In addition to bringing forward litigation to remedy harms like toxic dumping and water pollution that impact their communities, rural localities have passed laws that profoundly reorient the litigative playing field itself. These laws grant new entities like ecosystems the ability to bring legal actions, establish new statutory causes of action, and use novel forms of litigation to vigorously resist the environmental and other harms that corporate activity thrusts upon them. This Article is the first to comprehensively surface this rural litigative landscape and to reveal its deep significance. The litigative landscape challenges dominant stereotypes about ruralities, and reveals that plaintiff rural communities share urban areas’ concern with environmental protection, limits on corporate power, and upholding democracy. In these suits, ruralities act as bold, innovative litigative actors whose radical moves complicate the common wisdom about the urban-rural divide, reassert the deep democratic connections between litigation and self-governance, and open up new imaginative horizons for all communities seeking to combat collective harms.
